**JOHN WILSON v CAROLYN CHALMERS SIMPSON**

The Plaintiff appeared in Person.  
No appeared of the Defendant.

WILSON: Mr Adams, I have a summons to file against Carolyn Chalmers Simpson, supported by affidavit. I have been across to the Registry and they said, "No, judges are immune from that procedure" and I said, "No they are not". The second time I went to the same registry I showed them the Act which abolished the Star Chamber, which is actually the constitutional law in Australia, and it lays down penalties imposed upon judges should they offend against the Magna Carta. So judges are not immune.

HIS HONOUR: Show me the summons.

WILSON: That is the summons there and that is the supporting affidavit (handed up).

HIS HONOUR: I have read your affidavit and I have read your summons. Is there anything you want to say further, Mr Wilson?

WILSON: You have read the summons and you have read the affidavit?

HIS HONOUR: I have.

WILSON: Well, because they won't - they have been told by what they call a "Team Leader" on the fifth floor of the Registry, not to file the documents, and the Duty Registrar on Tuesday suggested I come and see you because you are the Duty Judge, and have it filed in court. So if you put the stamp on and say "filed in court" I will take it back there and complete the filing and then serve the papers on Mrs Simpson.

HIS HONOUR: Thank you. Very well.

FOR HIS HONOUR'S JUDGMENT REFUSING LEAVE TO FILE SUMMONS SEE SEPARATE TRANSCRIPT.

THE FOLLOWING REMARKS WERE ADDRESSED DURING THE MAKING OF HIS HONOUR'S JUDGMENT:

HIS HONOUR: You have set it out in your summons, but do you actually have a printed copy or a photocopy of the Act there?

WILSON: I do not think I have got it. You don't need it because - -

HIS HONOUR: Have you got a copy of her Honour's judgment?

WILSON: No, it is a nullity.

HIS HONOUR: That is not quite what I asked you; do you have a copy of the document?

WILSON: I have got a copy at home but I haven't bothered - -

HIS HONOUR: You haven't bothered to bring it?

WILSON: No, it is not necessary. I am not asking for relief, I just came to file it. I ask for access to the courts.

. . .

WILSON: Because you have denied trial by jury a couple of times yourself, so you are as guilty as she is, aren't you?

. . .

You swore an oath to do right. You asked God for help to do right. You are doing wrong. You are an evil-doer, aren't you? Isn't it about time you put the record straight?

. . .

They abolished the Star Chambers and if you censor me you are continuing the same evil they were doing.

HIS HONOUR: Mr Wilson, I am not being rude to you

WILSON: You have been more than rude to me, you have denied me my rights. This is fundamental to justice. . . .

That is not the last of it.
