OFFENCES Enter enclosed lands without lawful excuse (2)  
False representation resulting in police investigation

Sergeant Clark for the informant  
Accused appeared in person

HIS HONOUR: Now I am going to do Mr Wilson. Where is Mr Wilson?  
Come forward Mr Wilson. What's his number?

PROSECUTOR: What number?

HIS HONOUR: I want to get you away Mr Wilson.

ACCUSED: Going to what?

HIS HONOUR: I want to get you away.

ACCUSED: Well I want to estop proceedings because this is not a court. I challenge the jurisdiction of the court. In fact you are not a magistrate, you are a fraud. A magistrate should be appointed by a governor and a governor ought to be appointed by the Crown but I have the evidence here from the Privy Council that there are no appointments in the Privy Council for the appointments of Governor General or Governors in Australia, so you are in fact a fraud so –

PROSECUTOR: 47 and 48.

HIS HONOUR: I will formally ask you how you plead?

ACCUSED: There is no plead until I get a court of proper jurisdiction so that means a jury.

PROSECUTOR: Plea of not guilty.

HIS HONOUR: I will enter a plea of not guilty.

ACCUSED: You – I beg your pardon, I don't give you permission to make any plea on my behalf. Who do you serve? See this is the arrogance we have here. They know that their appointments are illegal.

HIS HONOUR: You come to court on 20 may Mr Prosecutor.

ACCUSED: And they bulldoze us under –

PROSECUTOR: Thank you your Honour.

ACCUSED: -- what are not laws at all. Now you are a fraud because there is no appointment for the Governor to be –

PROSECUTOR: Yes, he is going to go in the dock in a minute.

ACCUSED: -- in court of and the –

PROSECUTOR: he will be very close.

ACCUSED: -- Privy Council. I have it here.

HIS HONOUR: What's in it, couple of hours I suppose.

ACCUSED: A what?

HIS HONOUR: I am just trying to work out how long it is going to take.

PROSECUTOR: This is the –

ACCUSED: Well it's got to be a jury for a start. I have already given in the Challenge to the Jurisdiction, that was here last time.

HIS HONOUR: Three.

PROSECUTOR: Is this 47 and 48 your Honour?

HIS HONOUR: Yes.

PROSECUTOR: Thank you.

HIS HONOUR: I will set them both down fro hearing, no point –

ACCUSED: You won't do anything at all, you have got no jurisdiction. I challenge the jurisdiction of the court.

HIS HONOUR: Each matter is adjourned to the –

ACCUSED: I challenge the jurisdiction of the court.

HIS HONOUR: -- 20 May –

ACCUSED: You are not a magistrate, this is a kangaroo court.

HIS HONOUR: -- for hearing –

ACCUSED: A kangaroo court is a court that acts unfairly or dishonestly or disregards legal rights or disregards legal procedures. I – I have the right, you all have the right to trial by jury.

HIS HONOUR: record will show that whilst the accused has been talking I have not been listening.

ACCUSED: They disregard that and then you challenge the jurisdiction of the court that an illegal procedure

HIS HONOUR: I have been writing up the court papers.

ACCUSED: -- they disregard that.

HIS HONOUR: THAT MATTERS ADJOURNED TO the 20<sup>th</sup> –

ACCUSED: This is a totally kangaroo court.

HIS HONOUR: Mr Wilson.

ACCUSED: And these people are frauds.

HIS HONOUR: 20 MAY.

ACCUSED: They are frauds.

HIS HONOUR: You may go.

ACCUSED: Go where, what are you talking about?

HIS HONOUR: Out.

ACCUSED: Out what?

HIS HONOUR: Out of court.

ACCUSED: You have got no authority to tell me to do anything.

HIS HONOUR: I will adjourn the court, court is adjourned.
