**014646/08 - JOHN WILSON v STATE OF NEW SOUTH WALES**

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Plaintiff appeared in person  
Mr Hodgson for the Defendant

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HODGSON: I appear for the defendant. Mr Wilson appears here in person. I have a motion for summary dismissal, dismissal for want of prosecution.

PLAINTIFF: What did you describe me as; did you say I'm here in person or  
20what?

HODGSON: That's what I said.

PLAINTIFF: You did, well I'm not here in person. I am a sovereign human  
25being. I am a sovereign human being created by God and I have the inalienable right to trial by jury when twelve of my equals are, so help me God, to administer justice.

HODGSON: I have a notice of motion. I would have thought it's appropriate to  
30go to the Associate Justice, although in a similar matter of Lovett it went to Associate Justice Malpass and he returned it back and we ended up in front of the duty judge. I'm happy to take it to the duty judge if necessary, but I would have thought it falls within the scope of an associate justice's power.

35PLAINTIFF: It won't go to any judge, it's got to go to a trial by jury. It's my inalienable right as a sovereign human being. I will not accept anything inferior to what I'm entitled to.

REGISTRAR: Mr Wilson, have you filed an amended statement of claim?  
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PLAINTIFF: Denial of trial by jury is treason. You can't keep on ignoring it, Christopher.

REGISTRAR: I refer the matter to Associate Justice Harrison.  
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PLAINTIFF: No point, it's got to go to a jury. I am a sovereign human being with inalienable right to trial by jury, nothing inferior.

REGISTRAR: That's the order I make. Thank you, Mr Wilson.

PLAINTIFF: Where are we going now?

REGISTRAR: Associate Justice Harrison, court 7F.

5PLAINTIFF: Her again, what court's that?

REGISTRAR: 7F.

PLAINTIFF: Yeah, I've had dealings with her before. Got no respect for the
